## First Week of School

In Grade 1E we have been introduced to the turtle puppets "WALT" and WILF".

WALT stands for "We Are Learning To" (which is our learning outcome) and WILF stands for "What I'm Looking For" (which is our specific expectations). Currently in Math, 'we are learning to' demonstrate one-to-one correspondence when counting. 'What I am looking for' is to see the children count carefully by not skipping or counting an object again, and for them to record their findings by writing a numeral correctly. They had fun moving around the room to count and record the various objects in the baskets.














# Grade 25 has had a wonderful start to the

is studying the Torah in Jewish Studies with Hamorah Menucha and learning how the Torah can be as sweet as honey.










