## "How We Express Ourselves"

Over the last few weeks we have explored our unit of inquiry "How We Express Ourselves" with the central idea being 'Emotions are expressed in different ways'. We have identified different emotions such as proud, scared, excited, angry, disappointed and confused. In circle time we have discussed how we express these emotions, as well as why we feel the way we do. We have also explored how emotions can change through our actions. It has been an exciting unit for us as we have created lots of artwork to express our feelings and have read lots of books about the different emotions we have.

The children were very excited to work in small groups on their very first inquiry circle which allowed for them to choose, research and ask questions about an emotion of their choice. It was fantastic having Yael (Kaylay's mom) and Linda (Galia's mom) to come in help the children with their project. We have 2 more weeks to continue exploring our central idea in which we will focus on how the expression of our emotions affects others, and the children will share their finds with Pre-K S.

### Emotions are expressed in different ways

For our first unit of inquiry 'How We Express Ourselves' we have been busy inquiring into Emotions. At the start of our unit the children were able to express a few different emotions that they already knew, such as; happy, sad, scared, angry, surprised and excited and over the past few weeks, have started to understand and use a lot more expression of emotions (in the right context) that they have seen. They are now using words like; worried, frustrated, confused, embarrassed, nervous and astonished. They understand that emotions are expressed using our facial expressions and body language and that there are both positive and negative emotions. They have explored many different activities, music and multi-media to inquire further in to these emotions. Pre-K A's favorite two emotions are; 'surprised and frustrated'!

### HOW It WORKS:

Find an empty medium-size shoe box, approximately 18 x 30 x 13cm, Wrap the lld and box SEPARATELY in wrapping paper.

- Please secure the lid with an elastic band, and DO NOT seal the box (as it may need to be checked to ensure It meets Customs requirements).



#### WHAT TO PACK:

- HYGIENE ITEMS: each box must include a toothbrush + toothpaste and a BAR of soap. Other additional items can include face cloth, hairbrush or comb, hair clips or fles, baby wipes.
- EDUCATIONAL SUPPLIES: each box must include a notepad & pen/ pencil. Other additional items can include pencil sharpener, maths set, calculator, books (Chinese or simple English), erasers, colouring book. penal case.
- FUN & ACTIVE ITEMS: some ideas include playing cards, puzzles, stickers. card games, yoyo, small musical instrument, balls, skipping rope, travel size board games.
- SOMETHING TO LOVE: Items for them to cherish such as toy cars & trucks. robots; dolls, Jewellery, watch, wind-up torch, sunglasses, soft toys, wallet or purse.

### WHAT NOT TO PACK:

- NO FOOD / MEDICINE / WAR RELATED ITEMS (toy guns/ soldiers/ knives)
- NO CLOTHING or NO FRAGILE (TEMS Glass containers/ mirrors
- NO LIQUIDS of any kind (including blow bubbles/ shampoo/ bubble bath/ toiletry sets/aerosols)
- NO DANGEROUS (TEMS (marbles) sharp objects/ scissors/ razors)


