## Dvar Torah: Va'yigash

One of the main questions that our Rabbis ask is why hadn't Joseph contacted his father during all those years? Joseph became the second most important figure in Egypt and he must have had the ability to send a delegation to tell his father that Joseph is still alive. This, in turn, would have shortened his father's pain and suffering. The Ramban says that Joseph wanted his wish for his brothers to bow down to him to come true. Joseph waited until the very moment that his brothers bowed down to him, and then felt it was the appropriate time to reveal himself. Abarbanel thinks that Joseph had not contacted his father due to wanting his brothers to repent what they had done to him. Thus, Joseph waited until his

brothers came to Egypt and only in this Parsha does he hear a sense of regret from his brother Yehuda.

Rabbis also think that Joseph comprehended that if he were to contact his father, it would be the end of the family as Jacob would realise what had happened. Jacob would then be furious with all the other brothers for lying and telling him that Joseph was attacked and eaten by a beast when it was actually the brothers who had sold Joseph to the Egyptians.

Rav Yoel Bin Nun comments that the answer is much simpler. From Joseph's perspective, he was sent by his father to bring food to the brothers. The brothers then captured Joseph and sold him. Joseph believed that Jacob was also part of the plan to get rid of Joseph, making it a factor for not contacting his father for all those years. Only in our parsha, for the first time, does Joseph hear the story from Jacob's perspective, as Yehuda expresses, "We have an old father and there is a young son born to him... and his brother is dead." According to Rav

Bin Nun, Joseph now understands that his father believes that Joseph is dead. At this point, Joseph grasps what really happened and believes it is the appropriate time to reveal himself to his brothers. In this week's Parsha, Parshat Va'yigash, we read the dramatic episode of when Joseph revealed himself to his brothers twenty years after they had sold him to Egyptian merchants. Joseph unveils himself as his brothers stand before him, unable to recognise that they are standing in front of their brother, Joseph. When Joseph wants to keep Binyamin in jail, Yehuda interferes and demands his release. Only at this point does Joseph reveal himself to his brothers as he tells them, "I am Joseph, is my father still alive?" This event is followed by Jacob and all the family with Joseph in Egypt.

Let's learn from this parsha and communicate honestly in all our relationships.

#### The Thornthwaite Inheritance by Gareth P. Jones


Ovid and Lorelli Thornthwaite have been trying to kill each other for so long that neither twin can remember which act of attempted murder came first.


#### Love Medicine by Louise Erdrich

בספריה העברית שלנו, ולפי בקשת הקוראים, ישנם גם ספרים מתורגמים רבים.

אחת הסידרות המצליחות והמומלצות היא סידרת הספרים של הרלן קובן. הרלן קובן פירסם 30 ספרים, מתוכם 27 תורגמו לעברית. בספריה שלנו תוכלו למצוא את כל 27 הספרים שתורגמו.

לסופר יש קשר חזק ליהדות, קובן נולד במדינת ניו ג'רזי להורים יהודים אשר שם משפחתם המקורי היה "כהן". סבו, חיים כהן, נולד בירושלים ומשפחתו היגרה לארצות הברית בסביבות שנות העשרים של המאה העשרים.

הרלן ביקר מספר פעמים בישראל ויש לו קרובי משפחה בראשון לציון.

- הרלן קובן הינו סופר ספרי המתח, **ברוב ספריו יש עלילה יסודית החוזרת על עצמה**: יש דמות שנחשבת מתה או נעלמת ובמהלך הספר מתברר שהיא איננה מתה, או להפך.
  - הגיבור מתואר כאדם תמים אך מואשם בשלב כלשהו ברצח.
  - לגיבור ישנו בן/בת זוג שהוא מעריך ואף מעריץ. לגיבור יש דמות של "החבר הטוב ביותר" שמוכן למסור את חייו בעבורו.
    - העלילה מתרחשת ככלל בניו ג'רזי אך גם במנהטן.
- ישנו קישור בין הספרים מופיעה דמות או סיטואציה שהוזכרו בספרים אחרים, אף על פי שאין קשר עלילתי מוצהר בין הספרים.
  - גיבור העלילה הוא יהודי במקורו.



#### מחסה הוא הספר הראשון בסדרת "מיקי בוליטר" (אחיינו של מיירון)

למיקי בוליטר נדמה שהחיים לא יכולים להיות גרועים יותר. במהלך שנה אחת אביו מת, אמו התאש במוסד לגמילה מסמים, והוא נאלץ לעבור לגור עם מיירון, דוד שהוא בקושי מכיר, ולהתחיל לל בתיכון חדש. בבית הספר יש למיקי חברים חדשים ואויבים חדשים, ולמזלו – גם חברה חדשה ונפלאה, שקוראים לה אשלי. נראה שהחיים שלו מתחילים להשתפר – עד שיום אחד אשלי נעלמת כאילו בלעה אחתה האדמה. מיקי יוצא בעקבות הרמזים שאשלי השאירה אחריה, כי הוא לא מוכן שעוד אדם קרוב ייעלם מחייו. אך מתברר לו שהנערה המתוקה והביישנית שהכיר שונה בתכלית משחשב. הוא נחשף לפרשה כה מטלטלת עד שהבעיות בתיכון נראות לו לעומתה כמו משחק ילדים. הדברים המדהימים שהוא מגלה גורמים לו לפקפק בכל מה שידע עד כה על החיים.
